## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Horticulture classes are open to members of any Federated Garden Club of New York State. Sections F and G (Container-Grown Plants – Flowering & Foliage) are open to the public. Design Classes are open only to members of FGCNYS. Special Exhibits, with the exception of Sponsored and Youth are open only to members of FGCNYS.

The entry desk for Horticulture, Design, & Special Exhibits will be open Friday, June 4, 2010 from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. and on Saturday, June 5 from 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. **No entries will be accepted after 9:00 a.m.** Standard National Garden Clubs entry cards will be used. The show will be open to the public on Saturday, June 5, 2010 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. All exhibits must remain in place until the end of the show at 5:00 p.m. Saturday, June 5, 2010.

Judging to commence at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, June 5, 2010. Only the Judges, Clerks, Flower Show Chairman and Horticulture Consultants will be allowed on the floor during judging.

Any exhibit not in conformity with the rules of the Schedule may be removed by the Classification Committee. Decision of the judges is final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.

**New York State Conservation Laws & the Conservation lists of the FGCNYS and First District will be enforced.**

There will be an emphasis on fresh plant material. No artificial plant material will be allowed in any Division.

**National Garden Club** Standard System of Awards will be used for all competitive judging.

## AWARDS

### HORTICULTURE:

**Arboreal Award** – Rosette of **GREEN** ribbons

May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Horticulture Division, Sections A & C eligible.

**Award of Horticultural Excellence** – Rosette of **GREEN, ORANGE & BLUE** ribbons.

May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above judged as finest in the entire Horticulture Division.

**Award of Merit** – Rosette of **ORANGE** ribbons.

May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Horticulture Division, Sections B, D, E, F, G eligible.

**Collectors Showcase Award** – Rosette of **BROWN & GREEN** ribbons.

May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Horticulture Division, Section H.

**Grower's Choice Award** - Rosette of **DARK GREEN** ribbons.

May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in the Horticulture Division, Sections F & G.

**Jeanette De Lillo Award** – Will be awarded to the best evergreen in Section C (Conifers). Sponsored by Staten Island Garden Club.

**Sweepstakes Award** – Rosette of **GREEN & WHITE** ribbons.  
Awarded to the exhibitor having the greatest number of points in the Horticulture Division.

**Top Exhibitor Award:** 10 points each; First Place: 5 points; Second Place: 4 points; Third Place: 3 points; Honorable Mention: 2 points, and Participation: 1 point.

**Award of Design Excellence** – Rosette of **GOLD** ribbons  
May be awarded to a named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above, judged as the finest in the entire Design Division.

**Designers' Choice Award** – Rosette of **PURPLE** ribbons.  
May be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in the Designers' Choice Section, Section A. Classes 1, 2 & 3 are eligible.

**Petite Award** – Rosette of **BLUE & WHITE** ribbons.  
May be awarded to a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in the Petite Section, Section C. Classes 7, 8 & 9 are eligible

**Table Artistry Award** – Rosette of **BURGUNDY** ribbons.  
May be awarded to a blue ribbon winner in the Table Artistry Section. Classes 4, 5 & 6 are eligible.

### **Conchie DeLillo Award**

Will be awarded to the highest scoring design in Designer's Choice, Section A, Classes 1, 2 & 3. Sponsored by First District Judges Council.

### **Sue Fink Award**

Will be awarded to the highest scoring design in the Table Artistry Section, Section B. Classes 4, 5 & 6 are eligible. Sponsored by the South Shore Garden Club.

ALL plant material MUST be fresh & have been grown by the exhibitor. All container-grown plants must consist of one plant or crown, (except *Saintpaulia* trailers), and must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 90 days. Container may not exceed 10" in diameter. Container-grown plants may be double potted.

National Garden Clubs entry cards should be written in pencil and may be filled out in advance. They can be obtained from show chairman or at horticulture entry desk on June 4, 2010 or June 5, 2010.

Each exhibit must be named with the correct botanical name (Genus, Species and/or Variety), and/or common name whenever possible. Properly named specimens will be given preference when judged.

Containers and wedging material (bubble wrap), for all cut exhibits will be furnished by the Committee.

The Classification Committee, at its discretion, may subdivide any class, and resulting subclasses will be judged as individual classes. The Committee may remove any nonconforming exhibit.

Exhibitors are asked to pre-register with Ms. Schiffner before May 25, 2010. Registrations will be accepted in the order received. Exhibitors are required to list all plant material used on a 3" x 5" index card.

Dimensions & description of tables, etc. to be used in the Design Division are listed under the Class Headings in the schedule.

Designs must be the work of one individual. There will be no more than 4 exhibits in each class, and an exhibitor may enter no more than 3 exhibits in the Design Division. All exhibits must contain plant material but the plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.

No artificial flowers or foliage is permitted and fresh plant material may not ever be treated in any manner.

Accessories are permitted in all classes.

The following are not permitted: stuffed birds, butterflies, or other insects, fish, birds, or animals.

If unable to participate, exhibitor must provide a substitute  
And notify Ms. Schiffner of such substitute.
