Eligible for Design Excellence Award.

All plant materials must be listed on 3”x5” index card provided by the committee.

SECTION A – “VICTORIAN ELEGENCE”

Eligible for Designer’s Choice Award and Concetta DeLillo Award Exhibitor has complete freedom to choose plant materials and other components within NGC policies.

Class 1 – “A STUDY IN SCARLET”

A **creative** design staged on a black round pedestal 18” in diameter and 36” high. Design must include at least one **red** flower. Pedestal supplied by committee. (4 entries)

Class 2 – “THE REICHENBACH FALLS”

An **underwater** design staged on a white pedestal 18” square and 36” high. Pedestal supplied by committee. (4 entries)

Class 3 – “MURDER AT THE THOR BRIDGE”

A **stretch** design staged against a backboard 24” high x 36” wide x 24” deep. Backboard supplied by committee. (4 entries)

SECTION B – “SHERLOCK AND FRIENDS”

Eligible for Table Artistry Award and Sue Fink Award. Exhibitor has choice of fresh, dried, or dried treated plant material.

Class 4 – “BREAKFAST AT DARTMOR PRISON”

A functional table for one staged on a snack table 19” x 14 ½”. Snack table supplied by committee. (4 entries)

Class 5 – “HOLMES AND THE WOMAN ON BAKER ST.”

A functional table for two staged on a bridge table. Table supplied by committee. (4 entries)

Class 6 – “MYCROFT AT THE DIOGENES CLUB”

A buffet table for six staged on a rectangular table 30” x 72”. Table provided by committee. (4 entries)



SECTION C – “UNDER THE LENS”

Eligible for Petite Award.

Class 7 – “THE SMALL CLUE”

A small design using only fresh plant material to be staged in a black display unit 21” x 12”. Space allotted is 8 ½” x 5 ½”. (4 entries)

Class 8 – “THE AGRA TREASURE”

A small design using a combination of fresh and dried plant material staged in a black display unit 21” x 12” dominated by jewel like colors. Space allotted is 8 ½” x 5 ½”. (4 entries)

Class 9 – “LITTLE BEN”

A petite design using only dried plant material including a bell. Design may not exceed 5” in height, width, or depth that includes a bell. Bell supplied by exhibitor. Staged in a display unit 21” x 12”. (4 entries)

DIVISION III – SPECIAL EXHIBITS

SECTION A – “OXFORD EDUCATION” EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Exhibits 1 and 2 are competitive and are eligible for the Educational Award.

Eligible for Artistic Craft Award. Fresh and/or dried material permitted.

A decorated teacup and saucer. Teacup and saucer supplied by the exhibitor. (4 entries)

Exhibit 4 – “THE HOUND OF THE BASKERVILLES”

A decorated dog collar. Collar supplied by exhibitor. (4 entries)

Exhibit 5 – “THE SMELL OF INTRIQUE”

A decorated pipe. Pipe and stand supplied by the committee. (4 entries)
